Erikson's Psychosocial Theory: Industry vs Inferiority

- Main Question: can I make it in the world of people and things
- Industry -> self-confidence, autonomy, determination, self-awareness and responsibility
- Inferiority -> doubt, shame, guilt, feeling defeated and inferior
- Some Key Characteristics
 - · learn new skills: take on new tasks and responsibilities
 - Interactive modeling
 - Suggestion for Parenting: involve children in chores and planning
 - Produce Work:
 - take on tasks that require more complex skills: reading, writing, telling time
 - manage personal needs with minimal assistance
 - Suggestion for Parenting: co-create routines to increase ownership and responsibilities
 - Grow in Self Confidence
 - praise for effort, diligence, perseverance until task competition
 - can appear in forms of talkbacks, disobedience, and rebellious
 - Suggestion for Parenting: Praise specific efforts and do not get angry
 - If fail to gain industry, child feel inferior
 - learned helplessness, incapable of meeting expectations
 - suggestions for parent: treat failure as opportunity for learning and do not take over.
